Approval of Minutes for Previous Meeting

No changes were made to the minutes of the November 2024 meeting. All members in favor of accepting the November minutes as presented.

Principal's Report to the SAC

David O'Brien presented the Principal's Report to the SAC. ESM has a current school population of 79 students, with one new student expected to arrive in early February.

- Academics & Data
 - ESM has had no provincial assessments since our last meeting.
 - ESM continues to collect school-based data in both Math and Reading & Writing.
 - School-based assessments are used by teachers who work in a continuous cycle of assessment > planning > re-assessment > planning, and so on and so forth.
 - Assessments are used when looking at individual students, classes as a whole, for discussing between staff members in Teacher Support Team meetings and other collaborations, and as part of our school-wide reflection on our practices.
 - Student Success Planning
 - We will continue to have literacy, math, and well-being goals.
 - We are working to firm up our short cycle goals.
 - The principal literacy goal for all of HRCE is to have every student reading at grade level by the end of grade 2.
 - Our plan for support students with identified needs:
 - Tier 1 Whole Class
 - Tier 2 Small Group
 - Tier 3 Individual

• Maintenance & Safety

- Security cameras have been installed.
 - Security cameras were installed in response to a number of break-ins, which occurred last spring.
 - We do not have access to the footage yet, but we are waiting for that to be shared.

- The cameras are very high definition, and we are told that from across a parking lot, the cameras are able to identify a vehicle's VIN number, which is located on the dashboard of most vehicles.
- Two new outdoor plugs have been installed.
 - This will give us access to electricity outdoors without having to run cords through classroom windows.
- Fire safety standards have been checked again, and areas of concern have been recorded.
 - All standard will be brought to code by January 31, 2025.
 - These standards were sent to us from the HRCE from the Fire Marshall, and safety checks were conducted in-house.
