→ SSP Goals: and Reflection

- P-2: Starting the year with Ufli, and having more knowledge of phonemic awareness has made a difference. Teachers have learned to develop their programs and found new materials that improve small group lessons, making them more systematic and intentional.
- Gr 2 prepared structured literacy booklets in addition to whiteboards and learned that they help with data collection and keep the scope and sequence organized and all in one place.
- ◆ Whole school: We learned to create more unified practices as a staff: Students that have been identified as needing support are receiving systematic and explicit instruction of phonological and phonemic awareness in small group instruction at a Tier 1, Tier 2 level and Tier 3 levels. Resource, classroom teachers, Learning support teachers, are all using structured literacy as one of their pillars. Books are in our hands throughout the school.
- It has become clear that the phonological lessons are transferring to writing in early grades. We see this in conversations and observations and classroom work in reading and writing.
- Students have been observed doing behaviors that demonstrate that this transfer is happening. They are sounding out words and using vocabulary when talking about their writing that indicate that they are integrating this knowledge and using it to help them spell words.
- Grade 3-6 We noticed our data shows our reading results in the grade 3 assessment and 6 assessment were notably higher than our writing results. This observation will help us to set goals in cycle 2.
